

FAQ's

+ What does the price include?

The price includes accommodation, meals, transport around Senegal and workshops. The price excludes flight tickets to Senegal and personal expenses such as souvenirs or alcoholic drinks.

+ Does the price include pick up and drop off at the airport?

Yes. We will pick you up and drop you off at the airport.

+ What materials do you need to bring?

We will provide all materials for you. Take a look at our checklist of items you should and should not bring.

+ How many routers are joining?

Route gathers around 20-25 participants each edition from all over + teachers.

+ What about vaccines and Malaria?

The government of Senegal requires proof of <u>yellow fever vaccination</u> if you are traveling from a country with a risk of yellow fever. We recommend taking antimalarials before, during, and after their trip to prevent malaria, even though it is not mandatory and the risk is moderate.

+ Is a visa required?

No visa is required for stays under three months in Senegal. Passport validity must be for at least three months to be allowed entry.

+ What's the climate like?

Senegal is generally tropical, meaning it is very hot and humid. There is a rainy season from May to November with strong winds and a dry season from December to April with hot, dry winds. The warmest month is August, the coolest month is February, the wettest month is September, and the driest month is January.


- + Camera with an extra memory card, battery and charger (converter may be necessary).
